WHAT IS A TIC?

A TIC IS A SUDDEN MOVEMENT OR SOUND, THAT IS DONE WITHOUT THINKING AND IS DONE OVER AND OVER.

TICS GET WORSE WHEN SOMEONE IS UPSET OR EXCITED

SEEN LESS DURING SLEEP

Can sometimes be stopped for a little while

May not be seen when doing a favorite activity

Come and Go

ATIC CAN BE ANY MOVEMENT OR SOUND!
